Andrew L. "Andy" Taylor, 79 of Zanesville, died 8:20 AM Thursday, June 27, 2013 at Genesis Morrison House Hospice following complications from surgery. He was born Sunday, March 11, 1934 in Morgan County the son of Lawrence Taylor and Gladys (Barnhouse) Taylor. He married Rosalyn (Wille) Taylor on Sunday, September 18, 1960. Andy was Methodist by faith and attended Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Andy was a 1953 graduate of Malta McConnelsville High School. He was a veteran of the United States Army serving his country aboard in Germany. Andy retired from Sprint in 1995 following many years of service. He was an avid golfer and scored a hole in one in 2012. Andy enjoyed all high school athletic activities and was a longtime supporter of the Philo Sports.
