“ Uncle Pat Malone was a great friend throughout my lifetime.

In our earliest days we lived right next to mom-and-pop’s house. Pat Malone was our babysitter. He was a great storyteller. I do recall that he had just returned from his call of duty in the armed services. I believe he was stationed in the state of Washington. It must have been peace time, after World War II and before Korea.

I can’t recall the details, but I remember Uncle Pat regaling us with his heroics during the Yakima invasion. It must have been some kind of war games in Yakima Washington. But he made it sound exciting, so I remember.

He and I also had times to square off together on the basketball court. I was 10 years younger, so I could sometimes outmaneuver him. But we had some lively contests.

I believe Uncle Pat was a Notre Dame fan. But for about 50 years, every time he would see me he would ask: “what’s wrong with Notre Dame this year?”

But he was always fun to be around.

One of the funnest times was when he got married. Pat had always said that if he were ever to get married he would have his boyhood friend George Ellis marry him. George had become a lawyer and subsequently a judge in Houston. So when Pat was ready to get married he decided to come to Houston. This is where I lived, so he called me up. I had the privilege of attending his wedding in the Judge’s courtroom. I had the special privilege of being best man. And, since I was the only witness at the wedding, other than the Judge, I was also the maid of honor!

We had a wonderful wedding reception in my athletic club which was a block away. The club was excited to have Pat and his new wife for the event (there were five of us). They took a photograph

and in the next issue of the club newsletter had an article about how Pat had come all the way from Ohio to celebrate his wedding at their club in Houston.

Pat was (and I'm sure still is) a wonderful spirit!
